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Puget Sound Blood Center's Hemophilia Treatment Center (HTC) was established in 1974 as part of a federally funded, nationwide network of comprehensive care clinics dedicated to serving persons with bleeding disorders. Staffed by specialized physicians, nurses, social workers, and support staff, the Blood Center's HTC is dedicated to meeting the lifetime needs of patients and their families. Our program philosophy is a collaborative one which encourages patients and families to be involved in making important decisions regarding care.

HTCs are a critical resource for patients with bleeding disorders. A recent study performed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that patients with hemophilia who receive care at HTCs live longer and are less likely to be hospitalized for bleeding complications than non-HTC users.

The Blood Center's HTC is committed solely to caring for patients with bleeding disorders. We provide comprehensive medical services to meet the needs of patients throughout Washington State and serve as a community resource for patients, families, and other providers in need of consultative services.

Factor Program

The Blood Center's HTC recognizes that the high cost of treating a bleeding disorder can impact a family financially. Families may have difficulty obtaining insurance and paying costly out of pocket expenses. Some patients may find they reach their maximum lifetime insurance cap in a few short years.
