Bloodworks Northwest Extends Hours to Brace for Big Drop in Holiday Blood Donations

Thanksgiving Is a Perfect Time to Share the Gift of Life

SEATTLE, WA— Bloodworks Northwest has issued a special appeal asking people to schedule a blood donation during the next 10 days. Thanksgiving marks the beginning of the holiday season, when the number of donors visiting our centers and mobile drives typically declines by 15-20 percent with high schools and colleges on break, people traveling, family gatherings and other activities.

Starting on November 22 and extending until New Year's 2019, Bloodworks is <u>increasing hours</u> at its <u>donor centers</u> to encourage donations, with phlebotomists volunteering to work shifts so that most Bloodworks centers can be open on Thanksgiving Day.

Bloodworks has some cozy offerings for its donors this Thanksgiving. They'll be serving <u>hot cider</u> in the centers November 17 - 23. Donors who give on Thanksgiving Day will receive a stretch knit beanie to keep your head warm and make a stylish statement that you save lives.

As we enter the holiday season of giving, what better way to honor that spirit than by scheduling just one hour to save lives? While all blood and platelet donors are welcome, there's always demand for Type O blood and for platelets.

Donating blood takes less than an hour, and because blood can be broken down into its three components, each donation, about a pint, can potentially save three lives.

We count on the communities we support to help us. When it comes to patient needs there's no such thing as a vacation. The demand for blood is continuous to support the daily needs of local patients. People undergo surgeries and organ transplants. ERs treat traumatic injuries, and many people receive ongoing blood components for cancer treatment. And recent tragedies underscore the fact that having blood already on the shelves is essential when unforeseeable emergencies happen.

Donors can book appointments, or find a center or blood drive, in just a few taps on the new <u>Bloodworks App</u> available for download in the <u>App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>. As always, donors can make appointments at schedule.bloodworksNW.org or by calling 1-800-398-7888. People can also can check online for dates and times of community <u>blood drives</u> close to where they live or work by going to bloodworksnw.org.
