Seattle Mariners Honored by Blood Banking Industry for Blood Drive of the Year

More Than 3,200 Units Collected in 2020 at Mariners Pop-Up Donor Center

Seattle, WA —Seattle-based Bloodworks Northwest is honored to announce that the Seattle Mariners Pop-Up Donor Center at T-Mobile Park is being recognized nationally by America's Blood Centers' (ABC's) as the Outstanding Blood Drive of the Year. Bloodworks nominated the Mariners for this honor for the impact "Pop-Ups" have had on our community. America's Blood Centers says it was their most competitive category with 20 total nominations from 14 blood centers across the nation.

From April 13th to June 25th, 2020, the Pop-Up Donor Center at T-Mobile Park brought in more than 3,200 units of life-saving blood. 1,186 of these Pop-Up Donor Center donors were brand new donors. In the spring of 2020, the Pop-Up concept was a direct response to the challenges brought on by the need to collect blood under strict social distancing guidelines as the COVID-19 spread across the Pacific Northwest in the spring. The first COVID-19 fatality in the nation was confirmed here in Western Washington in February, 2020.

This was Bloodworks Northwest's first ever Pop-Up Donor Center. The Pop-Up Donor Center proved so successful that it was expanded to Lumen Field in Seattle, Tacoma's Cheney Stadium, The Paramount Theatre, The Museum of Flight in Seattle, The Portland Art Museum, and dozens of other venues across the Pacific Northwest. But it all started with the Seattle Mariners at T-Mobile Park.

The ABC Outstanding Blood Drive of the Year is given to one blood drive that has demonstrated excellence in promoting blood donation through recruitment and collections efforts, to establishing blood donation as a priority, either within an organization, in the community, or in a high school or college.

The award is given based on a combination of any or all of the following criteria:

- Circumstances (i.e., scheduled or disaster related)
- Demonstration of consistency of donations and support
- Demonstration of innovative recruitment techniques that can be replicated in other locations

- High ratio of units donated per group population (i.e., number of units donated / number of employees)
- Organization's leadership in establishing blood donation programs as a high priority within the organization
- Organization's leadership demonstrating a strong commitment to blood donation advocacy by challenging internal and external groups to become actively involved in their blood programs
- Overall commitment, enthusiasm and loyalty to the blood drive and blood donation.

ABOUT THE AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE: The Awards of Excellence program provides national recognition to individuals, civic groups, media, and corporations for their commitment to community and national blood programs.

"I want to thank Bloodworks Northwest for giving the Mariners the opportunity to make T-Mobile Park available to serve our community during this world-wide health crisis," says John Stanton, Seattle Mariners Chairman and Managing Partner. What is a Pop-Up Donor Center?

Pop-Up Donor Centers are multi-week drives in spacious, temporary venues which are providing the opportunity for hundreds of (socially distanced) donor appointments per day. Extended hours at permanent donor centers also play a key role in maintaining the blood supply. The award announcement was videotaped at a ceremony Tuesday, February 9th at T-Mobile Park.

Make blood donation Appointments at bloodworksnw.org or by calling 800-398-7888. **Donation is by appointment only to ensure appropriate social distancing**; no walk-ins. Also, no visitors and no visitors under the age of 16. All donors must wear a mask. Donating blood is safe, and there is no risk of contracting coronavirus from the donation process. (Source: <u>AABB</u>) Bloodworks policies comply with FDA, CDC, local health departments and other recommendations related to COVID-19. Bloodworks follows CDC guidance on wearing masks and other safety precautions.
